He's Still Out There for His Community

Retired D.C.F.O. (Director) Dave Nicholson Reg: 2696

It's a cold July morning when I contact Dave Nicholson, and I'm in the mood to interview. He's not too busy today and I've a free day, after spending six weeks painting my 92 y.o. house. I needed a rest after climbing scaffolding, ladders and the like and I sorely needed a well - earned rest. We met at the "Pancake Parlour" in Warrigal Rd, Chadstone thinking an hour should do the trick. Well, 140 minutes later we finally concluded the interview and hear it is!

We got down to business and out came a book of Dave's history and copious photos from the past. Dave lived in sunny Sunshine, and so did I. He started MFB recruits in 1973 and so did I. He was always intrigued by the fire brigade after first sighting a La France ladder appliance outside the Ballarat City Fire Brigade when he was a young fella. Ballarat born and bred, he stayed there until he was 17 years of age. He became a Bulldog supporter and supports them to this day.

Dave left the family nest and moved to Melbourne with his older brother and found a job at Fisherman's Bend as an administration assistant at the Aeronautical Research Laboratories. He shared a flat in Footscray with his brother and then bought a house in Hertford Road, Sunshine, just down the road from the old Sunshine Fire Stn (44). The administrative job didn't suit him all that well, so he tried a few other jobs and finally started working with a landscaper, planting small trees along the South Eastern, Tulamarine Freeways and the re-built Newport Power Station. It was here that he met a couple of firemen (yes, they were called firemen – then!). Peter Adamson and John Orange were the young fellas working "caz" on their days off from fire brigade shift work. A word or two in Dave's ear and shortly afterwards, he was selected to become a junior fireman starting recruits on January 26th 1973. His registered number was 2696 and his recruit course was the first at the new Training College, Abbotsford. Frank Tueno was the CFO at this time. Fireman Dave, remembers some of his recruit mates back in 1973. Some of those were, John Watkins, Rob Horne, Keith Adamson, Brett Hume, John McFayden, Peter Egan and Steve Short. There were 23 on his course.

As a "Westie", Dave was to be stationed at 47. First day on shift was 47 Stn "A" platoon. Not long after starting his first shift, the bells came on it was a full sprinkler call to "Bradmills" in Yarraville. Stn's 45, 47 and DO Laurie Lavelle responded. On arrival, Dave was confronted with a deceased male cleaner, who had poured a flammable liquid onto the factory floor to do some polishing. The cleaner started the machine, a spark was generated and what followed was a massive explosion and fire. After the fire was extinguished, Dave was tasked with placing a tarpaulin over the deceased cleaner. (Great start to this new job as a fireman!). Dave remembers S.O. Kevin Roderick coming over to him and placing his arm around his shoulders and asking if he, Dave, was OK. (R.I.P. Kevin Roderick – great person, friend, fine officer and firefighter).

This job as a firefighter was a real awakening to the young Dave Nicholson. Dave remembers a few of his old work mates from those days. Ken Heddle, Kevin Hede, Peter Adamson and Jack Cockburn. He later switched to "D" platoon and worked with Noel Ewer, Brian Thompson, Jack Harbrow, Bob Undy and a few others (See photo).

After a few years as a "firie" having lots of turnouts, fires, false alarms, and fun at Stn 47, it was time to think about the future, not forgetting his wife and young family, a promotion to officer rank beckoned. Time to open the books and get studying. A Station Officers Course was held in 1979 and Dave was accepted and passed the course with flying colours. Note: As an F/f and Officer at 47, Dave learnt a great deal from experienced F/f's & Officers. In 1983, Dave followed on and completed the SSO's course. A few of the fellow candidates on his course were Ron Darby, Brett Hume, John Perry and Peter Maloney.

As time went on, the 1973 Recruit Course Reunion was held at Café Alma, on Victoria St, Abbotsford. Many turned up (15) and lots of reminiscing went on for the duration of the evening.

Dave moved steadily up the MFB ranks and passed the District Officers course in 1985and found himself back at Footscray Fire Station as the District Officer. His officers were SSO Alex Shepherd & S.O. Noel Ewer – both great officers! Dave remembers some of those men out west who gave him good advice along the way: They were Jack Harbrow and John Cannon.

Now, a move sideways to the MFB Communications Centre. Dave was responsible for the 4 x shifts on duty as well as being the focal point for communications to the media & tabloids in regard to fire and other emergencies during his time there as the officer in charge.

One of the large fires which occurred in Melbourne during his time as an Assistant Chief Fire Officer, was being responded to the St. Kilda Town Hall on the corner of Brighton Road. It was a "red, red, red! He remembers the front of the town hall was unscathed, however at the rear was a massive fire ball of flame which was rapidly taking hold. This was back in 1991. A large bushfire fire he and a task force were sent to, was the N.S.W. bushfires of 1994.

When Dave was appointed as Director of Community Safety, he was tasked with leading a group from the Structural Fire Safety Dep't including Dexter Hayes & Christine Ilioskos, who were tasked with ensuring the MFB standards for the City Link Project were met. This was an integral role in world's best practice. He credits former CFO Geoff Godfredson with setting a high standard of fire protection including the use of a fire drenching (water), smoke extraction, fire hydrants and evacuation systems to ensure safe tunnels egress for all users. Note: There have been over the years, a few major fires and incidents, where the safety systems have been automatically implemented and worked perfectly without a hitch, thus saving life and property.

A few other names which Dave credits his successful firefighting career are the following: Alan Richards, Maurie Foster, Shane wright & Joff Manders.

These days, Dave is still active in promoting fire safety to seniors in the community. This is via FRV Seniors Fire Safety Program. Dave along with five other retired personnel give fire safety talks to senior citizen organisations, Probus groups and other like-minded senior groups.

Dave has 9 grandchildren. This keeps him very happy & busy. Travelling in the past, his favourite places were Greece, Mexico, Cuba where he travelled with his dear wife, Di.

Dave retired in February 2006 after 33 years in "the best job in the world". He spent many years in Operations, Fire and Community Safety Departments as well as the Comm. Centre.

Come to the August meeting & catch up with Dave and some of your old mates.

EVIE officially announced and first FRV livery photos released

It's official! FRV's first Electric Vehicle for Incident and Emergency (EVIE) will arrive in Victoria later this year.

EVIE combines the latest innovative firefighting equipment and technology in a high-performing zero emissions vehicle.

A first for FRV, and only the second fully electric appliance in Australia, EVIE will be a valuable addition to the state's firefighting fleet and allow the trial of this new technology.

Commissioner Gavin Freeman AFSM said: "We're extremely proud to introduce EVIE to FRV as part of the modernisation of our vehicle fleet."

"We'll be evaluating all aspects of the truck's performance to help inform future decisions about the integration of electric fire appliances into our service."

Commissioner Freeman said an expert FRV team, including representatives from the UFU and workshop personnel, has been involved in the design of the vehicle every step of the way to deliver the greatest benefit for firefighting crews and the Victorian community.

"We thank the project team and the UFU for their highly valued contribution," he said.

Expected to arrive in September, EVIE will be gradually introduced to service in early 2025.

Patient reunion



In June, Paul Diamandis, 53, went into cardiac arrest while at his son's football training at Donvale Football Club. Michael Wolff and Jamie Fabris were nearby coaching the under 15s football team and immediately jumped into action.

Michael called Triple Zero (000) before beginning CPR. He swapped with Jamie to continue compressions and raced to grab an automated external defibrillator (AED).

Michael and Jamie continued CPR and administering shocks from the AED while Nathan Close, Shane Bishop, Mark Sigmont and Cameron McGregor from FS27 Nunawading and Ambulance Victoria paramedics rushed to the scene.

On arrival, firefighters and paramedics worked together, continuing CPR to stabilise Paul.

Paul was transported to Box Hill Hospital and has recovered to make a return to his beloved local footy club. He reunited with Michael, Jamie and the firefighters and paramedics who helped save his life.

Michael and Jamie's quick use of CPR training and an AED, while quickly calling Triple Zero (000), played a major role in the successful outcome.
