GONE BUT NOT FORGOTTEN

Articles like these as we have often stated, are the hardest because of the memories that keep flashing up. In this case whilst I did not know Bruce, I, similar to many others know his father Bill (Matt) Dillon very well and would never want to go through the same devastation as he of losing a son.

Bruce Edward Dillion, 1962-29/7/2015. The following are extracts of a letter I received from Matt, regarding Bruce's life and the overwhelming celebration of life conducted by members of the club that he was President of for 16 years.

Matt & Judy's son did not smoke or partake of alcohol and

was a conscientious worker who unfortunately was diagnosed with Brain Cancer 5 years ago and was advised there was nothing they could do for him, in fact informing him that he only had about 18 months to live. On hearing this there was an immediate call to arms from Bruce's wife, Matt's family and his club mates, they were going to do everything within their power to help him if it was possible beat this insidious condition.

The club members set about painting his house and building a gym in his garage. This gesture gave him a great lift and a positive outlook about his condition. Bruce who already had a great love of roses planted many different types, and with his veggie garden it became his little slice of paradise. One thing he could not handle was inactivity so he talked his boss into giving him some part time work, against his

doctor's orders. Matt told me that Bruce, knowing full well what the outcome of the condition would be, confided in him that he would organise his funeral and make sure his wife would be OK.

The bond he had with his club mates never wavered. They would call in and spend time not only at home but also take him to the club for coffee and a chat. There was no doubt all that support was helping, in fact at times he was feeling so well everyone was starting to wonder if the cancers were in remission, unfortunately that was not the case as some time later the cancer took hold causing Bruce to collapse.

He was immediately transferred to St Vincent's where he was advised that he only a week or so to live. His wish to be sent home could not be accommodated due to the fact he was too ill.

The best they could do was to transfer him to Healesville Hospital Palliative Care Unit which was closer to home. His club mates rallied around the family keeping a vigil with his wife and Matt's family. The members and their wives not only looked after the shopping, bills etc they would ensure he almost had a visitor 24/7. The Doctors commented he would not have survived as long as he did without the love & support of the family & club mates.

The Funeral (Celebration of Life) was as he wanted, Matt was left speechless There was approximately one thousand mourners at the service many from overseas and interstate and they led the way to the Healesville Cemetery. After he was laid to rest, each club member filed past and with the special spade placed at the grave site placed soil on the

casket. Matt was then given the honour of doing the same. There was no one who did not shed a tear as he was such an integral part of their life.

Matt and the family were then escorted back to the club house by his mates with Bruce's Harley leading. The members and their wives who are aged between 40-70 years would tell Judy & Matt what their boy had done for them. Matt and his family want it known they will never be able to thank the club members & families enough for the love and support they have showered upon them.

One little thing that Matt did not put in the letter was, he & Judy would drive from Bairnsdale to Healesville & back at least three times a week to assist them. Unfortunately the worry of

Bruce's illness did not help Judy who herself was going through her own medical condition.

Matt, on behalf of all the RFA & Brigade members we are thinking of you and Judy at this tragic time, do take strength from all the love, support and kind thoughts from Bruce's club mates.

CHANGES TO POWERS OF ATTORNEY



The powers of attorney legislative framework will change when the Powers of Attorney Act 2014 (Vic) commences on 1st September 2015. The key changes are:

- Increased clarity around the roles of each party to a power of attorney and the point at which a power of attorney becomes active;
- 2. Improved protection of the interests of individuals making powers of attorney; and
- 3. The introduction of the new supportive attorney appointment (to enable people to retain the dignity of being able to exercise their decision making capacity longer than is presently formally provided for).

Existing powers of attorney will remain valid after the new legislation has commenced. The new legislation does not affect medical powers of attorney or guardianship relationships.

A giant step forward for the **CFA members.** Craig Lapsley Emergency Management Commissioner confirmed that the authority has been provided funding for EMR implementation to all integrated stations by the 2016/17 financial year. The program will be delivered to all CFA integrated fire stations over the next two years. Funding this financial year will allow 19 integrated stations; the remaining will be covered in the 2016/17.

Training will commence with the **South Morang and Mornington stations** in the final quarter of 2015.

Gladstone has had an airport firefighting service for less than a year, but these men have been recognized as Airservices Australia's Crew of the Year.

Here are six things you may not have known about the service:

- 21 staff in the station, including six new recruits and eight permanent staff.
- 1 emergency situation where a Virgin plane called in 30 kilometers from Gladstone with a problem. It burnt off fuel but landed safely.
- 25 airport aviation firefighting services around Australia, and Gladstone won Crew of the Year.
- 1 year ago the Gladstone crew began to set up and the station officially opened in August 2014.
- 2 hours per shift is spent in the gym as part of the firefighters' contract to keep physically fit.
- 4 of the criteria for the St Florian award is based on: professionalism, innovation, teamwork and community service

Melbourne Fire fighter Stair Climb Saturday 5th September 2015

Wearing 25kgs of fire fighting gear, 343 fire fighters from MFB, CFA, SA, NSW, QLD, New Zealand, Alaska and New York climbed for a Cure up the 29 floors of the Crown Metropol. The goal was to raise \$250,000 for cancer research at the Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre. Congratulations to all who competed, the total raised for Peter MacCallum Cancer Centre was \$250,072!



Early start predicted for 2015/2016 fire season.

Its official the CFA have advised that the Southern Australia Seasonal Outlook has predicted that Victoria is heading towards an early start to the fire season with an above normal fire risk.

CFA Chief Officer Euan Ferguson says "In Victoria the temperature and rainfall over the next few months will be critical in determining the fire threat, fuel growth and conductions this summer.

Whilst August to October are traditionally Victoria's wettest time of year, a decade of below average rainfall means the state remains quite dry. Even with average rain fall over this it is unlikely that we could see a reduction in the fire risk.

Chief Officer Ferguson also stated "It's important to be aware of the fire risk Victoria is likely to be confronted with over summer, and we will be again be working closely with out emergency management partners and the Victorian communication to appropriate respond to these risks.

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
